### Dear FO° Supporter,

Thank you for your generous and continued support of Fair Observer. Your belief in our mission to make sense of the world allows us to do what we do. Our mission is simple: We inform and educate global citizens of today and tomorrow by focusing on the deeper issues behind the news, providing context and publishing well-reasoned perspectives from around the world.

Almost in the blink of an eye, another year has passed. Fair Observer continues to evolve and grow in exciting directions. Last year, we began a new training program for young editors, which is now an instrumental part of FO°. New recruits join us for an initial three months, after which they can choose to extend their time with us.

From this program, we recruited a full-time assistant editor, Anton Schauble. He assists our editor-in-chief with the publication process and the coordination of workflow with volunteer assistant editors from around the world.

In 2023, FO° has significantly increased the quantity and variety of content — articles, timelines, multimedia, podcasts, videos et al. — while maintaining a high level of quality. From June to November, traffic to our website has increased by more than 50%. Notably, each reader is spending more time on our website and articles.

Meanwhile, the FO° Meetups that we launched have been going from strength to strength. We are building new communities in many major cities: San Francisco, Washington, New York, London, Paris and Geneva. We believe that the best way to educate ourselves is through dialogue, conversation and community. That is why we meet in person to converse about everything under the sun.

After all this work in 2023, we have no intention to stop. We have exciting plans for 2024. This includes the founding of a sister platform in the French language to widen our audience. Notably, we plan to publish content translated from French in *Fair Observer* and vice versa, creating bridges between the Anglosphere and the Francophone world. Our sister French platform will publish and reach French-speaking peoples in Africa, Canada, the Caribbean, Europe, French Guiana, the Middle East and the Pacific.


