Dear FO o Supporter,

In the first quarter of 2024, we have focused on publishing content and training our young editors.

On April 1, 2022, we inaugurated a new model at our organization. Since the very day we began publishing, our content had been largely outsourced. However, we kept our editing in-house because we wanted to make sure that everything we published was fact-based and well-reasoned.

Long before the post-truth — Oxford Dictionaries' international 2016 international word of the year — we disliked the noise on social media. We came to believe strongly that we could not pass on the burden of responsibility to judge the honesty or the quality of the piece to our readers. However, as the number of our authors rose to well over 2,000, the model of in-house became unsustainable

So, we listened to Jai Shekhawat, a longtime supporter of Fair Observer, and "worked on the business, not just in the business." We decided that we would retain a core group of in-house editors but also seek volunteer editors from around the world whom we would train ourselves.

As of 2024, we are proud to let you know that this model is a success. One of our alumni said that our workshops are much better than a master's course in international relations at top universities. Many supporters, including senior business executives and government figures, have dropped into our Saturday workshops and given us a thumbs-up.



During this first quarter, one of us has been on a criss-cross tour of India. Yes, it is our founder, Atul Singh, who cannot seem to stay in one place for far too long. During his travels, Atul addressed fund managers and military officers on geopolitics and the global economy. He also conducted workshops at two Indian Institutes of Technology on critical thinking. As Peter Isackson, our chief strategy officer, and Ti Ngo, our chief financial officer, say in unison: "Education is the beating heart of Fair Observer."

Education for us does not mean exams, which are all the rage in many Asian countries and increasingly so in the US. We believe in a grounded humanities education that enables us to think deeply and broadly and enables us to make sense of the world. For this reason, we publish excerpts of books, organize discussions and educate our young editors in workshops every week. We hold true to our North Star. After all, our mission is to inform and educate global citizens of today and tomorrow.

We want you more involved in our mission. Would you like to publish with us or do you have friends who would like to publish with us? Remember that we are now recording podcasts and videos using Zoom. Might you want to help us with marketing, business development or fundraising?
